AIM:

PRINCIPLES:

- Affirming good practice and support new learning
- Bringing international experts as "critical friends" (comparative experience)
- Giving visibility to examples of good quality in practice, policy and structure

SOME REFLECTIONS:

- Review is advice, not inspection
- Report is not an academic analysis, has limitations
- Creation of ownership important (ToR, process)
- Recommendations are "delicate"
- Follow-up work decisive
- Added value: international outreach
